As you might be informed already by Terri, we have started a study in Holland with the ASR-hip. With this study we will compare the manual to the computer navigated procedure.

At the moment one of the steering committee members (despecies difficulties with the ASR. There are two issues:

1. Movement of the cup in the acetabulum (deflection? or....); I believe you have seen the x-rays and we briefly discussed this during the 20 YR anniversary of Corail in Lyon.

2. Increased Co Cr concentrations in the blood of ASR patients (one year post-op) and patients complaining about pain without

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## obvious reason.
